From Rev Tom

Over recent weeks, I've become aware of a recurring theme — the sense of being strangers in our own land. It's a feeling that echoes Jesus' words: "I am not of this world." Yet as I speak of this, I'm conscious that I might sound like those right-wing voices who rail against immigration and demand that "real Australians" should defend some imagined European-Australian culture. These groups lash out at almost everyone — anti-Palestinian while being anti-Semitic, anti-Indigenous, anti-Asian, and anti-women — longing for a supposed golden age of white male privilege. Their rhetoric thrives on fear, especially fear of being "overrun" by newcomers. Perhaps that fear lingers in our collective memory because, deep down, we know what our own forebears, arrivals from overseas, did to this land's First Peoples. Until we find a just reconciliation, that unease will remain part of us.

But my own sense of alienation has nothing to do with immigration or cultural change. It arises, instead, from what those same far-right voices often champion — the harshest expressions of modern capitalism, or what we now call neoliberalism. This system gives free rein to competition, glorifies inequality, and reduces homes to financial assets. It weakens governments designed to serve the common good, erodes trust in law and institutions, and allows greed to reign unchallenged. In such a world, it's easy to feel like an exile — a stranger in a society that no longer values community, fairness, or compassion.

Recently, we read from **Jeremiah 29:4–7**, where God tells the Israelites, exiled in Babylon, to "build houses and live in them, plant gardens... seek the welfare of the city." It's a call to remain faithfully present — to live as God's people even in a foreign culture, maintaining identity while working for the common good.

That same spirit lies at the heart of our new initiative: employing someone to help us strengthen and serve our local community through the Charlestown Church complex. Even when society feels foreign, we are called to live creatively and generously, to replace competition with community — and to let our actions quietly express the love of Christ, who commands us to love others as ourselves.





Spiritual Practice of the Week

Prayer of Recollection: The prayer of recollection represents a specifically "restful attitude" of connecting with the reality that God is in me. As we let go of distractions, this prayer recalls the soul to its true centre and identity in Christ.

Practice: Find a quiet place where you can sit comfortably before the Lord. Take some deep breaths, relaxing your body and quieting your mind. Offer yourself to God. Ask him to gather up the fragments of your scattered life and recollect your soul. Rest before him. When distracting thoughts come up, write down one word that expresses your distraction. Let the thought go and return to your rest in God. • After ten minutes look at the words you have jotted down. What stands out to you? What anxieties do you see? Where is your identity centered? • Confess that you are not called to control all that disrupts your life. Return these concerns to the Lord. Let him hold the concerns of your heart as you rest in him.
