From Rev Tom

The Founding Assembly of the Hunter Community Alliance is just happening at the wrong time for the best update of information to our "Contact" magazine as it doesn't happen till tonight and perhaps by the next "Contact" publication it will be old news. Nevertheless, here is a bit of the latest news of how it is all proceeding. 958 people are registered to attend. The Uniting Church HCA reps original made a commitment for 120 to attend, but during the meeting we were cajoled by David Barrow, the lead organiser to push that to 150. That has made me a bit sleepless at times!! However, I just looked up the registration chart and there are 184 UCA registrations. The will be a pre-assembly gathering of Uniting Church attendees and I am really looking forward to that. It will be the largest single gathering of Uniting Church members I have experienced since I arrived in the Hunter. Rev. Allison Forrest from Toronto will be leading the pre-assembly, and our presbytery chairperson Rev. Greg McConnell will be welcoming our Moderator Rev. Faaimata (Mata) Havea Hiliau who will speak to us about the gospel imperative for our participation in the Founding Assembly, and then our presbytery minister Rev. Grahame Perry will pray leading us into the Assembly meeting. One thing I found interesting as we lead into the Assembly. Various anti-renewable groups have tried to register to disrupt the gathering. We were compelled to let the politicians attending know this was happening. There has been constant communication with the politicians about how we were dealing with this and safety protocols. Finally, we were able to get back to the politicians and say that there is no problem. Their office staff wanted to know how we knew that. We said we have vouched for every person attending. Apparently (not sure which office) the office staff were stunned. "How can you vouch for all of them!" Our reply, "We know them all!" The Hunter Community Alliance is a special organisation in this way. We are a gathering of organisations who know their people. We are all part of something. Apparently, this is so unique it just amazed the political staffers. What they will also not have experienced before is what happens at the Assembly. All the organisations represented at the meeting will be introduced. Everyone who is present is prepped to cheer in those introductions, unions, churches, community groups, cultural groups. Those politicians will be stunned by the positive energy they will witness tonight, and they may not have ever seen anything like it ever before ... except maybe at the football or a Taylor Swift concert. Not at a public meeting with politicians. The politicians will be asked to commit to certain asks. Of course, both the Alliance and the politicians want to be able to say "Yes" on the night, so there is negotiation about those asks right up until the last minute. So, while they can change, here are the asks at the moment: On Housing:

- nousing.
- Including %s Affordable and Social Housing in the Hunter (the % still being negotiated)
 - Hunter Park
 - Broadmeadow development
 - Transport Oriented Developments
- Package for Hamilton South
- Raising the issue of the need to removing no-grounds eviction from NSW

Climate, Transition & Community:

- Affordable renewable energy for low-income households
- Funding for the new Renewables Skills Centre at Tighes Hill TAFE
- Educators to support our communities to participate in any off-shore wind-farm planning processes
- The need for NSW Government to have an off-shore wind strategy & to properly fund the Hunter Transition Authority.

The process of getting to these asks begins with conversations with members of the community. One-on-one relational meetings. After all the stories are gathered we look for the most common concerns. When those concerns are discerned, research teams are organised (usually including experts in the field) to determine practical goals that are achievable. We then have to form our "asks" according to the sphere of influence of the politicians with whom we are negotiating. For example, our asks to local mayors are very different to asks of federal ministers. Our final ask is always "Will you meet with us again in 6 months' time to follow up on progress". It is amazing stuff to see it in operation. And we are excising our biggest influence for the public good that has ever been available to us as a Uniting Church.
