Becoming What Eastertide Celebrates

We are now in the season of *Eastertide*—the fifty days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost. This time in the Church's year invites us not only to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus but to allow its meaning to settle deeply into our lives. It's a season of joyful transformation, where we are gently invited to become what Eastertide celebrates: the living Body of Christ, empowered for witness.

One of the things I've come to realise more fully this year is that **my story is part of the greater story**—the story of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. This story isn't something I just believe in from a distance; it's something I'm being drawn into. And that changes how I live. I don't follow the risen Christ by willpower or effort alone. I live because I've been included in a story where resurrection is not only real—it's happening, here and now.

This shapes how I respond to the world around me. In places of disappointment or difficulty, I can trust that something new may yet emerge. In the face of injustice or suffering, I'm called not to despair, but to live and act with hope—because the Spirit of the risen Christ is still at work.

Eastertide reminds us that resurrection is not just a historical event; it is a present and ongoing reality. Like the first disciples, we are being formed into a community that recognises Jesus in the breaking of bread, in the peace offered to one another, and in the people and places we often overlook.

As we move toward Pentecost, we do so as people being prepared—opened more and more to the life of the Spirit. May this season stir in us the courage to live as witnesses of resurrection, carrying the peace, hope, and love of Christ into a world that longs to be made new.

Spiritual Practice of the Week

Face-to-Face Connection: happens through the gift of presence and body language.

Practice: Practice arriving early or staying late at events so you can loiter and have face time with people. What conversations come up because you are there in the flesh?

Statement from the Uniting Church in Australia Assembly on the Election of a New Pope

Uniting Church President Rev Charissa Suli

The Uniting Church in Australia joins with Christians around the world in prayerful thanksgiving and deep reverence as the Roman Catholic Church welcomes a new spiritual leader, Pope Leo XIV.

This is a sacred and historic moment, not only for the Roman Catholic Church but for the whole body of Christ. We honour the movement of the Holy Spirit in this time of discernment and give thanks for the faithful leadership that has brought the global Catholic community to this point.

We celebrate the historic election of Pope Leo XIV, born Robert Francis Prevost in Chicago in 1955, the first pontiff born in the United States of America. A member of the Order of Saint Augustine and dual US-Peruvian citizen, Pope Leo XIV served in Peru as an Augustinian missionary, parish priest and teacher, and was later appointed by the late former Pope Francis as the Bishop of Chiclayo. He has held significant roles within the Vatican. His choice of the papal name 'Leo' pays homage to Pope Leo XIII, renowned as the Pope of Catholic social teaching and the rights of workers.

We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Pope Leo XIV, whose first greeting in Italian and Spanish began with the simple yet profound words of the risen Christ: "Peace be with you all." We affirm our shared hope in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and our call to be bridge builders, bearing witness to justice, peace and reconciliation in a fractured world.

We pray that God will grant Pope Leo XIV the wisdom to lead with humility, the courage to walk with truth and love and the grace to listen deeply to the cries of the earth and the hopes of all people. May this new season of leadership be marked by compassion, faithfulness and unity in Christ.

On behalf of the Uniting Church in Australia, I offer our prayers and our ongoing commitment to nurturing the ecumenical relationship we share with the Roman Catholic Church. Together, as one people of faith, we walk in step with the Spirit who unites us.
