### 31 March 2024

#### **From Rev Tom**

The day I am writing this is Holy Wednesday. The Gospel Lesson for today is John 13:21-32. This is part of the "Last Supper" scene and focuses on the betrayal of Jesus by Judas. Just as Jesus dismisses Judas to go and finalise his treacherous plans Jesus says, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him." This seems such a puzzling thing to say. If Jesus had said, "Now the Son of Man will be glorified" it would be much easier to understand, we would presume he is pointing toward the resurrection. But "Now the Son of Man has been glorified" challenges interpretation. A thought that presses on me more and more each time we traverse the Easter season is that, as it were, we celebrate the wrong day. We perceive the miracle of Easter in the wrong element. We have inverted the message of Easter and thereby destroyed much of its contemporary power, and lost the wisdom that it sheds on our experience of life. When Jesus was talking about his glory he was not at all referring to his resurrection. His glory was not a party trick we wake up to on Easter Sunday. The glory is the betrayal by his closest allies. His glory is the apparent failure (as seen by everyone around him) of his earthly mission. His glory is in the complete denial, and misrepresentation of his supremely life-giving, and uniquely generous message. His glory is his suffering and final death. We are desperate for a good news story that makes us winners. In that way we all rush to Easter Sunday. We write off the travail of Jesus' journey as something done for us so we get the prize at the end. But that is to misinterpret Jesus, and it is to misread the nature of our journey. So much of the essence of Jesus glorified in his suffering is brought into focus in the words of Richard Rohr, "The pain you don't transform you transmit"! The unique characteristic of Jesus is that he transforms everything. He becomes God, or reveals himself as God, by way of having all the possible evil poured out on him, that denies anything and everything of good in him, and yet he transmits none of the resulting pain. He transforms it all in his commitment to love and love becomes his essence, or is his essence. In so doing the resurrection is not the reward, it is an inevitability. Love is not destroyed, love transforms. So how does this change the way we respond to life? Well, the invitation to us is to become the counterpoint to the world's way of seeing things. It is not for Christians to win, in the worldly sense of winning. It is for us to completely be free of identification with outcomes so that we simply love endlessly, even as the world appears to rebuff, abuse, and ignore our love. It is to transform all the pain that is felt by us and love in return. That is what to win is. It amounts to dying in the eyes of virtually every other human being and our own. The Greek words for this are agape and kenosis. The eternal winning is to experience failure but to still love, to still hope, to still have faith. This way betrays no one and particularly doesn't betray God. Resurrection becomes an inevitability! Of course, even as Jesus beckons us into this way of life none of us achieve this (a camel through the eye of the needle stuff) but even our failure is caught up in what Jesus has already done. Somehow even our struggle, and failure, to love ends up all being part of the good (Romans 8:28).
