From Rev Tom

Two weeks ago, I put a note in Contact about plans to put a large TV screen in the foyer. Well, that (huge) TV is now sitting in its box on the stage in the hall. The next step is to attach it to the wall above the Uniting Church label on the eastern wall. It will then be connected to the internet. Once all that is done we will set up an account with www.yodeck.com. Using this website, we can design info screens, and notices, use fills like a clock, the weather, and so on. We then stream the material from the website to our screen. This is part of a larger mission! In my Neos work time, I tried to make connections in the community and endeavoured to find a place where we could invite people to gather. This is part of a concept called placemaking. It is about building community. It has been a challenge. I then realised that we already have people coming to the Charlestown Church, throughout the week. They typically arrive as independent groups. They have little, to no awareness of the other activities in our facilities. Why not change that? Why not help the groups recognise that they are part of something bigger, that each group is part of a larger group, a larger group that includes us, the church? This is where the TV comes in. The intention is for the TV to display all the things happening at 24-26 Milson St and the wider work of the congregation. As people walk in and out they are encouraged through what is on the screen to get a sense of the larger thing they are connected with. Along the way, with all this, we discovered we can apply for funding from the presbytery to help develop our project. So right now, we are preparing an application to employ a community engagement worker. It is likely to be for about 1 day a week at this stage. Their task will be to connect with each of the community and congregation groups, get photos and info and prepare to have all of that info displayed on the screen at the times the church is being used. We also plan on a major update of the website. The update will involve a shift from focussing only on the church to communicating all the things that are happening on our property. So, people will be encouraged, when finding out what is happening in their group, to go to our website. Further, and we will have to see how things go, it could develop into where our "Contact" is not just a contact for our congregation, but for all the groups – our little community newsletter. Again, it is all in the planning stage, but watch this space.



Let the current take the distractions away. Don't follow the distractions. Gently return to God repeating "Here I am." Let the current of God's Spirit carry you. • What is this like for you?



Fresh Expressions - Part 2 (see last week's Contact for Part 1)

Examples of Fresh Expressions?

It is usually small and simple and might have other names like micro-church, faith community, dinner church, Forrest church - there is so much variety. A Fresh Expression is different to a missional initiative. A missional initiative might not necessary be an intentional community - it may be a café for instance or a community garden. A Fresh Expression will always be intentional about moving people towards discipleship and faith and forming an intentional community.

This happens through careful listening to the neighbourhood as well as building solid relationships - this could take years.

New Three Step Pathway

We have a vision to see Fresh Expressions thrive in our Synod. This means they need to be free to start up, be supported, encouraged and financed by our structures and institution. We have a new three-step pathway!

EXPLORE

To know more about Fresh Expressions, come to our EXPLORE gathering that is held online twice a year. We encourage everyone to join and learn more about Fresh Expressions and hear stories of starting new initiative from those leading the gathering. The next Explore online session coming up on 6 November with Carolyn Meers — registration details can be found here.

FORM

This is our training program for Fresh Expression leaders. There will be an apprenticeship/coaching model involving some teaching to help form leaders who want to lead Fresh Expressions communities. This is an evolving space so keep watching!

CONNECT

This involves a few things.

<u>Website</u> - A webpage focused on Fresh Expressions is currently in progress which will provide resources and connect you with the right people to help you start something new or get the information you need.

<u>Connect groups</u>- These groups are self-initiated and designed to support Fresh Expression practitioners. A list of them is available on our webpage. Connect groups come together to offer mutual support and encouragement through prayer, learning, or sharing the challenges and joys of mission. Group sizes can range from as few as 3 people to as many as 12.

<u>Authentication</u>- what does it take for a Fresh Expression to be seen and authenticated as a "church" in its own right? How do we "ordain" Fresh Expression leaders? How can we support presbyteries to support Fresh Expressions? How do we encourage traditional churches to plant Fresh Expressions? How do we grow Fresh Expression leaders? These are questions that need deep thinking and planning. We are wrestling with these questions currently and would love to hear from you if you have some ideas.

Currently, our Fresh Expressions steering team includes Andrew Smith, Christine Palmer, Leigh Gardiner, Will Small, and Rod Pattenden. They're available for a coffee and chat if you'd like to discuss anything related to Fresh Expressions. We'd love to hear your thoughts!

Our vision is to see Fresh Expressions grow as a thriving movement within our Synod. We aim to support and nurture this community, knowing it's challenging to embark on this journey alone. If you're passionate about starting something new or want to be part of this evolving community, we invite you to join us. We'd love to have you on this journey!
