From Rev Tom

This week I was given cause to read the 1 Corinthians 13 passage – the passage about love, "Love is ...". I had two examples this week, two men in this case, who in some way have lived this passage, and that has given me opportunity to understand this passage better. The first fellow is an elderly gentleman who perhaps simply had the fortunate gift at birth of a personality that had so many characteristics of love. But then he experienced everything of his life. No doubt he experienced plenty of challenges in his life. But rather than becoming reactive to those negative aspects of his life experience, he maintained his good will, didn't demand things go his own way, was not irritable or resentful, stayed patient and kind. What happens is that as he maintains this approach to life then he becomes what he lives. Literally, he becomes love. That is why the Corinthians passage says, "Love is ...". I met another fellow this week. Much younger. I had a bit to do with him about 20 years ago. He called me out of the blue. He wanted to talk to me because his wife wants a divorce. He described himself as having had a bad temper. However, he said that he and his wife have gone to lots of marriage counselling, and he has done a lot of work of his own. What was clear to me was that he loved his wife, and unfortunately wasn't blessed with the same sort of character as the other gentleman I mentioned. But this love for his wife, and his love of his children, has meant that he has worked on himself. I remember when I knew him 20 years ago that I thought that while he was a likeable chap he seemed a little bit just about appearances. There didn't seem to be much depth to him. He had little self-awareness. But when I saw him this time I was amazed by the transformation. He was able to reflect deeply about life, and his life. He had developed the capacity to observe himself, and recognise the impact that he had on other people. He was able to acknowledge, even as it caused him great pain, those things about him that had caused his family so much hurt. It was clear that because of his love for his wife, and even though it might be too late for his marriage, he remains committed to living love. That commitment has transformed him, in what I saw, where he began "doing love", and then becoming love. Love had now become who he is. That was the depth that I could see in him. Perhaps a good challenge, as a reminder to practice this way of love, that we might indeed become love, is to replace our own name for the word "love" in the Corinthians reading: ⁴ (Name) is patient; N is kind; N is not envious or boastful or arrogant ⁵ or rude. N does not insist on its own way; N is not irritable or resentful; ⁶ N does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. ⁷N bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." And as we live these things we will discover the meaning and truth of the last statement, "8 Love never ends"

\$10,000 Grant

Our congregation has received a \$10,000 grant from the Hunter Presbytery Mission Development Fund. The purpose of the grant is to conduct professional property studies on our Charlestown and Garden Suburb sites, in order to provide information about possible uses and income earning capacity. We will be guided in this process by Uniting Property. Information gained will assist us as we decide how our properties will be used to generate income.

Income from our properties will be used to provide a sustainable financial platform for our "Neos" Mission. Anne will be speaking at the Presbytery meeting on 22 November to provide an overview of our Mission project.
