From Rev Tom

It was an exciting time last Thursday. I must admit I tried to get out of the job feeling a little daunted by the task. It was time for the Hunter Community Alliance to check back with the Mayor of the Lake Macquarie Council, Kay Fraser to ascertain how she had been going on the 10 commitments she had previously made in November 2021 before her re-election. The meeting was held at 3pm at our Garden Suburb Church. I chaired the meeting. I was supposed to co-chair with local Anglican lay person Karen Lizoain, however ended up having to have significant dental surgery the day before, so I was on my own. Anne Threlfo had organised the audio-visuals and timing protocols. We had Kelly Hanson, the CEO of "Nova for woman and children" as our Housing/Homeless research team representative. Peter Coughlan was the Hunter Alliance Climate Change research team. There were some 20 or so folk from various churches and organisations from around the Lake Macquarie Local Government Area, and Mike Smith and Sue Warren provided personal stories on the housing crisis, and climate change respectively. We also had our newly minted community organiser Helen Fielder-Gill present (who so happens to be the daughter of Rev. Dan Armstrong). Mayor Kay Fraser had made 5 specific commitments to address the housing crisis, and homelessness in the Lake Macquarie region. One of those commitments was to trial a locker initiative for people experiencing homelessness where they could store personal belongings for a limited period. Mayor Fraser was able to indicate that a trial was underway in Toronto. We continued to work through the other issues with other positive responses. In terms of climate change she affirmed the commitment of the council to reduce greenhouse emissions by 50% by 2030. We realised that Mayor Fraser on this occasion was talking about the emission by council, however the original commitment was in relation to all activities in the LGA. So, with this discrepancy and other issues still to be realised we asked if she would be prepared to meet again with our two research teams before the end of this year, to which Mayor Fraser agreed. It was great to participate in such an activity, with a large representation and participation of Charlestown Uniting Church folk, to make a real impact on government policy and commitments in this region. There will be another major event on the 28th September at 6pm there will be a Community Assembly where the Hunter Community Alliance members (that includes all of us) are invited to come and help decide what issues we will take to our local member candidates as we move into the state elections. These events are wonderfully stimulating occasions experiencing people passionate about the things in their local communities that affect us too. This meeting is at the Southern Cross Hall, 841 Hunter St, Newcastle West (You get food too). If you are thinking about going to this please contact Anne Threlfo. It would be fantastic to have as big a contingent at that meeting of Charlestown and Garden Suburb Congregation members at that meeting as came to the meeting with the mayor. If you can't physically attend the other option is to pray for the event and the ongoing work of the Hunter Community Alliance.

The Role of the Church Council

The Church Council gives priority in its life to building up the Congregation in faith and love, sustaining members in hope, and leading the Congregation to a fuller participation in Christ's mission in the world. This priority is reflected in the agenda of its meetings.

The Role of an Elder

In our congregation, all members of the Church Council are considered to be Elders. Eldership is exercised in an individual way, depending upon the gifts of an individual, and their position on the Church Council.

Each member of the Church Council, in their capacity as an Elder, has a small group of congregation members for whom they pray, care for pastorally, and act as a point of contact for any concerns.

Positions Vacant

Chairperson

Incumbent – Anne Threlfo

Role:

- Lead Church Council meetings (and other roles as stipulated by the UCA Regulations).
- Assist the council in remaining focussed on the established goals of the Congregation.
- Provide support and encouragement to Elders on the Church Council.
- Support communication between the Council, Ministry Agent, sub committees and congregation.

Radical Hospitality

Incumbent – David Chegwiddden

Role:

- Coordinate the pastoral care of members of the congregation, and support the Minister and Elders in this pastoral role.
- Identify and support members of the congregation in their pastoral caring for each other and for the community.
- Identify, support and seek opportunities for radical hospitality to be expressed within and beyond the congregation
- Attend Church Council meetings and report to the Council bringing recommendations and matters to be communicated to the congregation.

Passionate Worship

Incumbent – Margaret White

Role:

- Support the Minister in the provision of worship, meeting regularly with the Minister and the worship team.
- Encourage the congregation to encounter God in worship, and bind people to one another in the experience of worship.
- Attend Church Council meetings and report to the Council bringing recommendations and matters to be communicated to the congregation.

Intentional Faith Development

Incumbent – Ken Young

Role:

- Encourage, support and provide opportunities and resources for the spiritual growth of the congregation.
- Facilitate regular meetings of the Spiritual Formation, Education and Discipleship Team.
- Attend Church Council meetings and report to the Council bringing recommendations and matters to be communicated to the congregation.
