#### From Rev Tom

Today's message is a reminder that if at all possible you join the Hunter Community Alliance "Candidate Forums 2023". We are running up to the State Elections. This gives ordinary citizens a short period to really get would-be local state members to promise to do things that we really care about. We can do this through the Hunter Community Alliance. I am on the Steering Committee for the Hunter Community Alliance. I am not so involved in the preparation for the forums this time. Last time was the Lake Macquarie Mayoral Forum and I was a co-chair. Gladly someone else has the task this time and I can have a breather! However, I am really committed to invite as many people as I can to the State Government election Forums. The importance of people being a part of this is firstly, to pressure each of the candidates to commit to our "asks". The second reason is to show the politicians that the Hunter Community Alliance, as a gathering of organisations across the Hunter Valley, is a force to be reckoned with. The Alliance is about getting democracy back to the ordinary people, rather than just the conversation going on between politicians and lobbyists. The Uniting Church and its previous denominations of the Methodist, Presbyterian, and Congregational each have long histories of being involved in politics, particularly in relation to giving voice to those who are the most downtrodden and least powerful in our community. One of my strongest memories was Rev Alan Walker making a stand against the Vietnam war. Another is of Sir Ronald Wilson, who was a President of the Uniting Church, was the commissioner for the National Inquiry into the Separation of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children from their Families. Well, we have learned that we can do a great deal more when community organisations band together. So, the Hunter Community Alliance includes churches, unions, environmental groups, disability groups, and social support organisations. Together we (that includes you and me) plan on asking the State Government election candidates to commit to these proposals – 1. Restore the social housing safety net of all local government areas within the Hunter to 5% of total housing stock by 2027, and increase social housing stock at least every three years once social housing reaches the 5% target. 2. Replace 'No Grounds Evictions' provisions with 'Reasonable Grounds Evictions'. And for the Newcastle electorate there will be a third ask of, "We ask that you commit to at least 50% social and affordable housing at any future residential development at the proposed Hunter Park." As for the issue of Climate Change our ask is, "If the party you support forms government, will you commit to the establishment of a Hunter Valley Transition Authority, by no later than mid 2024, with an initial recurrent annual budget of at least \$65 million, for a period of 10 years?" All these proposals are thoroughly researched and we will have experts in both fields explaining why these proposals can work, and are fundamentally important for the good of our community. The invitation is for you, if you are able, to join one or both of the forums. Both Forums are by Zoom, and there is nothing expected of you other than joining, adding to the numbers, and being blown away by how great these events are! The Forum for those in the Wallsend, Cessnock, Maitland, and Port Stephens area is on Wednesday 6:30, 8<sup>th</sup> March. If you would like to be part of that one click HERE to register! 

### A PASSING THOUGHT ...

Last week I mentioned that during Lent, we would look at the "I AM" sayings of Jesus and, quite contrary to my instincts, let's start at the last one – why? Well, as Jesus said it to his disciples on their way over the Kidron Valley after the Last Supper, I think it possibly was to mean something more to us. The Bible passage is printed at the end of this reflection; John 15:1-17.



Jesus said in verse 5: "I AM the vine, you are the branches." If you have a peak at the last verse of the previous chapter, Jesus says to his disciples: "Rise, let us be on our way." So, the setting is the walk from the Last Supper, via the valley, to the Garden of Gethsemane where, though it was night, it was a full Passover moon, the vineyards would be clearly visible as they toddled along. As with most of Jesus' simple sayings, usually there is a perfectly natural comparison at


hand. This case, the vines. Verse 2..."He (God) removes every branch in me that bears no fruit." Whoops, for we all know that if God sets his mind to it "behold it was very good"...imagine how sharp his pruning knife would be...you certainly wouldn't find a better one at "Bunnings"! God does this if we become unproductive in our mission to assist other folk in a belief in Jesus. Once a friend said to a group of us (and she was 96) "There is no retirement in the Kingdom of God!" (Rene died at 104.) Mind you, none of escape the normal pruning as we are being 'cut back' to simply 'bear more fruit'.

You see, Jesus wants to make us part of his ministry. Notice in verse 15 a subtle, but hugely important, 'change'. Jesus calls his disciples (us, dear folk) "friends"...no longer "slaves" – we have become 'partners' in Christ's ministry!

Now, take a good look at verse 5. Quite often, there are two mistakes we can make when we attempt to 'work for Jesus'. We can succumb to pride, and believe that our own talents are enough to get the job done, or we fall into the trap of despair, when we find that things aren't really going the way we thought they would! From past experience, I would suggest that we have all fallen into that scenario! The question we should then ask is the old chestnut: "is it a God idea...or just a good idea?" The last phrase in verse 5 says it quite clearly: "without Me you can do nothing" Earlier, Jesus said; "I can do nothing on my own but speak just what the Father has taught me." It surely stands to reason that if Jesus can't, then neither can we! Of course, there is yet another hitch. Have a good look at verse 16...for there we find some more clues to our Spiritual journey. Two I would emphasise – "Jesus chose you", not the other way around and "go", for many, we haven't left the starting blocks yet!

We should all be happy after reading this passage of Scripture -look at verse 11! For if I can truly achieve nothing, nada, zip, zilch, zero without him, then surely the pressure is off! If our calling is not to produce fruit, but to simply bear fruit, then the burden is on him, not us...all we have to do is to stay connected to Jesus through our faith, prayer, Bible reading and loving obedience in order to find what God can do through ordinary partners, like us, in ministry.

#### John 15:1-17 Jesus the True Vine

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. <sup>2</sup> He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes<sup>III</sup> to make it bear more fruit. <sup>3</sup> You have already been cleansed<sup>III</sup> by the word that I have spoken to you. <sup>4</sup> Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. <sup>5</sup> I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup> Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. <sup>7</sup> If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. <sup>8</sup> My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become<sup>III</sup> my disciples. <sup>9</sup> As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. <sup>10</sup> If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. <sup>11</sup> I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

<sup>12</sup> 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. <sup>14</sup> You are my friends if you do what I command you. <sup>15</sup> I do not call you servants<sup>(a)</sup> any longer, because the servant<sup>(a)</sup> does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. <sup>16</sup> You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. <sup>17</sup> I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.
