A PASSING THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

WOW! A pigeon pair, no less...well... sort of...You may remember singing, with great gusto, that beautiful hymn; "As the deer pants for the water

so my soul longs after thee"?

These are the first two lines of the hymn. The prolific Jewish/Christian hymn/song writer Martin Nystrom wrote these words based on the first two verses of Psalm 42 – which you will also see on the next page.

Now, Psalm 42 is meant to be sung or said together with its mate Psalm 43, not Psalms of David, but a part of a collection of those authored by The Sons of Korah. They have been put together for our reflection when God seems just so far away! When in the pits of despair, we have a tendency to think that we, alone, are the only ones who have ever felt this way...No, no, no! Believers in every generation have had this desperate feeling, even today and I would suspect, tomorrow.

Let's take a closer look. Verses 1-4 are a feeling of complete dryness - emptiness with v5-7 asking why are you so downcast? v8-12 tell of feeling overwhelmed, with again the refrain of v13&14. Then, turning to Psalm 43, we find the same introductory four verses asking why are we/you so downcast?

I reckon that these two psalms could be the heart cry of anyone who has lived on this planet which was created by no less a person that our very own God! For we have all experienced deceit and unfaithfulness on a number of levels...whether in romance, business, friendship...you name it!

You see, these psalms cry out for us to be honest with God; not to be afraid to ask Him questions; to help us restore our faith; to learn from the bitter place in which we are and will come from.



When I have fallen into this state of sadness, forlornness, I remember reading in a book about pressure being applied to me (For, yes, I was feeling very sorry for myself!) Our much maligned friend, coal, when placed under extreme pressure for many centuries, produces a "girls' best friend" – a diamond. Without pressure being applied, something beautiful and precious would not be revealed. Then there is an oyster, all at peace minding its own business, when an annoying smidgen of grit creeps into its shell...so irritating is the grit's presence, that the oyster gives it a lovely smooth covering which, in time, its 'epiphany' will be a gorgeous pearl! So many things only come to their fruition after being placed under extreme pressure – hardship! God actually allows us to be placed under pressure, too, as part of our refining process in our Christian pilgrimage.

Next time you are feeling down, glum, out of sorts with God and everybody else, make sure you get to Church to worship with other believers, don't stay away – step number one. Two, speak – tell – God just exactly how you feel, for do you know what? It will be true music to His Heart, you have been taught, therefore, to be honest with God!

Praise the Lord!!! Hallelujah!!!

Psalm 42

- 1. As a deer longs for the running brooks: so longs my soul for you, O God.
- 2. My soul is thirsty for God, thirsty for the living God:

when shall I come and see his face?

- 3. My tears have been my food day and night: while they ask me all day long 'Where now is your God?'
- 4. As I pour out my soul by myself, I remember this: how I went to the house of the Mighty One, into the temple of God,
- 5. To the shouts and songs of thanksgiving: a multitude keeping high festival.
- 6. Why are you so full of heaviness, my soul: and why so unquiet within me?
- 7. O put your trust in God: for I will praise him yet, who is my deliverer and my God.
- 8. My soul is heavy within me: therefore I will remember you from the land of Jordan,

from Mizar among the hills of Hermon.

- 9. Deep calls to deep in the roar of your waters: all your waves and breakers have gone over me.
- 10. Surely the Lord will grant his loving mercy in the day-time:
- and in the night his song will be with me, a prayer to the God of my life.
- 11. I will say to God, my rock, 'Why have you forgotten me:
- why must I go like a mourner because the enemy oppresses me?'
- 12. Like a sword through my bones, my enemies have mocked me:
- while they ask me all day long 'Where now is your God?'
- 13. Why are you so full of heaviness, my soul: and why so unquiet within me?
- 14. O put your trust in God:

for I will praise him yet, who is my deliverer and my God.

Psalm 43

- 1. Give judgement for me, O God, take up my cause against an ungodly people: deliver me from deceitful and wicked men.
- 2. For you are God my refuge why have you turned me away? : why must I go like a mourner because the enemy oppresses me?
- 3. O send out your light and your truth, and let them lead me:

let them guide me to your holy hill and to your dwelling.

- 4. Then I shall go to the altar of God, to God my joy and my delight: and to the harp I shall sing your praises, O God, my God.
- 5. Why are you so full of heaviness, my soul: and why so unquiet within me?6. O put your trust in God: for I will praise him yet, who is my deliverer and my God.


