From Rev Tom

I have been using some of the post-Christmas and New Year periods to do some planning for the year. It became apparent that this year the Christian calendar moves quickly. Ash Wednesday is the 14th of February, so we will be in Lent shortly, and Easter Sunday is March 31. I bet the hot cross buns are up for sale! Usually, at this time of year, I endeavour to encourage everyone to come up with some New Year resolutions. We can get a little cynical about New Year resolutions ... the resolutions that we never keep. However, even that tells us something. It causes us to face our lack of capacity to stay with our commitments. And then we have learned something at least, rather than if we had simply ignored the whole thing altogether. And as we call ourselves Christians we are committing to be followers of Jesus, we are making a commitment to be on the way to somewhere. So, I think, as Christians, we have an even greater cause for setting ourselves New Year resolutions. But what would that resolution be? Well if you know you have particular problems with New Year resolutions then make the start small. Perhaps deciding to read the Gospel that is set for this year, the Gospel of Mark. Sit down, read it through, done! New Year's resolution complete. Perhaps it is to decide to read a Christian-themed book. Koorong Christian Books is now at 10 Medcalf St at Warners Bay. Parking is right next to the entrance. And there is an abundant range of books. Or you could set a spiritual task. One task that I think would be great for all of us is a commitment to be less negative. Paul talks about being filled with the Spirit, which has the qualities of love, joy, peace, patience, and so on. But the trouble is we spend so much time thinking negative thoughts that the Spirit doesn't get much of a look in. We too often think that our negative thoughts are necessary. We must judge people. Nothing is further from the truth, remember "do not judge lest you be judged!" I read just the other day of a woman who was told to count whenever she started thinking negatively. She would count, "1, 2, 3, 4 - 4, 3, 2, 1 - 2, 3, 4, 5 - 5, 4, 3, 2 - 3, 4, 5, 6 and so on to 100. If she got lost she would start again. She said that it was amazing how she found she had so much more energy doing this. Why did she have so much more energy? Because all our negative thoughts drain energy. We deplete ourselves. Negative thoughts rob us of energy and leave us without what is needed to do the good the world so desperately needs. In any case, what other New Year resolutions? What about contacting someone who has gone off your radar, and it would be good for both of you to reconnect. Maybe a member of your family. Maybe the next-door neighbour. I want to push you in this. So much so I have this space here. Grab a pen. Make sure you have a comfortable seat. Spend some time in reflection. My New Year resolution is! Write it down, here:

2023 Christmas Appeal

As many of you might remember we had money saved from when we had support from Target, but, due to the generosity of you, our church family, during that period, we had enough cash to be able to continue supplying Northern Settlements which is now known as "MOSAIC multicultural connections" and also both East Lakes and West Lakes Women's refuges for a few years.

This year we were able to support 13 MOSAIC families (being made up of 16 adults and 20 children) giving a total of 75 gifts.

Imagine our surprise when we approached the 2 Women's Refuges, that we support with gifts, to be told that they had been inundated with gifts this year and were not requiring assistance. This was just as surprising as it was wonderful to hear that the community was gathering together to support Women and children escaping difficult circumstances.

On the other hand, Mosaic continue to need, and are very appreciative of, our assistance which we are able to continue with the reserves we still have.

We donated 46 gifts to Lifeline as they were not suitable for our current clientèle, but would be useful to others as well as helping Lifeline as they would be income producing for them.

Praying that 2024 is a year of blessings for all of you.


