From Rev Tom

Many in our congregation are living through the challenges that come with the later seasons of life. Some are facing the drama of serious illness or the loss of independence. Others are beginning to notice the smaller signs—those little reminders that our bodies are not as strong or as reliable as they once were. These changes can stir anxiety and uncertainty, because the gift of health and independence is precious, and its loss can feel like chaos.

Yet our Christian faith has always held a word of comfort for such times. We are never left alone. We are always held in the love of God—just as a child is held securely in the arms of a caring parent, whose attention meets every need. Jean de Caussade spoke of this as "abandonment to divine providence"—an invitation to entrust ourselves to God's care, even when we cannot see a way through. In the very moment when we lose our ability to manage for ourselves, there is still the tender mercy of God sustaining us.

We might remember the story of Jesus asleep in the boat. The waves were crashing, the disciples were certain their lives were ending, and yet Jesus was at rest. That image reminds us that even when our world feels storm-tossed, God's presence is steady, sure, and unshaken.

Faith also calls us not to judge—not only others, but also our own circumstances. When we loosen our grip on judgment, new possibilities appear. We may discover that while we are indeed "falling"—falling from health, falling from independence—we are at the same time falling into care: into the hands of family and friends, into the skills of medical teams, and ultimately into the eternal goodness of God.

This is the hidden gift of faith: that what first appears to be only loss can, with new eyes, be seen as grace. It may not take away the struggle, but it does open us to the love and goodness that surround us, even in the hardest of seasons.

I pray for each of you who are living with the storms of illness, frailty, or loss of independence. May this time, as difficult as it may be, also become an opportunity to notice the grace, love, and care that uphold you day by day—a living testimony to the God who holds us all.



September 23rd 2025

At 3 Edward St, Cessnock NSW 2325, Australia (office of Dan Repacholi, MP), 2pm – 2.30pm

This vigil is part of <u>#EndTheWaiting</u>, a national campaign led by the Australian Churches Refugee Taskforce. Together, we are calling on the government to act now and grant permanent protection to refugees who have been trapped in limbo for over a decade.

Thousands of lives hang in the balance. Every day in limbo strips people of hope, dignity, and a future. No new laws are needed—just the political will to act. It's a choice between justice and delay.

As churches across Australia, we say: A fair go should be for all. "I was a stranger, and you welcomed me." (Matthew 25:35) These words must shape our nation's policies.


We are calling for:

- * A pathway to permanency for all asylum seekers failed by Australia's broken system, including those processed under Fast Track.
- * Work rights for all asylum seekers while their claims are processed.
- * One visa that lasts until a claim is resolved—ending the endless cycle of short-term renewals.

This is a peaceful, public vigil. People of all faiths (and none) are welcome. Let's gather together, raise our voices, and call for a permanent future for all.
