I had a Spiritual Director a while ago who often reminded me that God plants God's story everywhere, our task is to take notice! I guess our interests and talents influence where we see God. For example, I can look at a floral arrangement, recognise God's handiwork in the beauty of the flowers, and the skill of the florist, but I can't tell the difference between a daisy and a dahlia!

For me, God often shows up in films. In fact, I'd say there are very few films where God doesn't make an appearance in some way. (I should mention I tend to avoid horror and excessively violent films!) Two recent films which have stood out are Four Letters of Love and Life of Chuck. I'll share some thoughts about why, without giving away spoilers!

Four Letters of Love is set in a beautiful Irish landscape and tells the story of two men, who in their own ways are attempting to respond to a Divine force which they barely understand. One man in particular, finds that the decision to follow a God ordained path has far reaching consequences, not only for his family but for others with whom he becomes connected. He finds himself at odds with just about everyone around him in this response to God's calling, which he finds unexplainable, even to himself. There are other mystical elements in the film, events which can't be explained rationally, yet in another way make perfect sense. And underpinning it all is the Divine force which holds everything together, the four letters: L.O.V.E.

The Life of Chuck is the story of Chuck's life told in three acts – simply enough, except that the acts are presented in reverse: Act 3,2 then 1. The end of the story is a bit puzzling to work out, until you see the beginning! The film explores the profound value of a single life, and the beauty and importance found in everyday moments. It addresses the uniqueness of each of us; the universe we hold within us made up of all our experiences, thoughts and relationships. Consequently, every person is important since without each of us, creation wouldn't be quite complete. This film is best approached without knowing too much, so I won't say more! (The Life of Chuck is on at Lake Cinema this weekend, Friday 3rd to Sunday 5th).

You certainly don't need to have a deep knowledge of film to notice where God might be present; just as I don't need to know the name of a flower to appreciate its fragrance! What about you? In which films have you noticed God's story planted? I'd love to hear.




You are invited to an Interfaith


