In 2014, when the Abbott Government cut nearly a billion dollars from projected overseas aid, The Sydney Morning Herald described the move bluntly: "Foreign aid budget plunges to lowest level in Australian history." ABC News reported it under the headline, "Budget 2014: Aid groups vent anger over cuts to foreign aid spending." Yet this year, when aid fell even further relative to national income, there was scarcely a whisper of public concern.

Bit by bit, Australia's interest in overseas aid has faded. During the 1970s, '80s and '90s, aid organisations were woven into our cultural life and featured prominently in mainstream news. Thirty years ago, World Vision's annual 40 Hour Famine was the country's largest community event. Millions of Australians sponsored hundreds of thousands of mostly young people who went without solid food for a weekend. The event was covered on virtually every radio and television network and raised \$7.4 million in 1991-a substantial sum for the time. By 2016, however, that figure had fallen to \$2.2 million, and the event now receives no media attention at all.

During the Howard years, many aid agencies shifted focus from raising funds from the public to relying on government grants. The price of that shift was their public silence in the face of government aid cuts. As Tim Costello observed in 2012, "Charities are receiving up to 90% of their budget from government. At some point, they crossed the line from being clear about their purpose, independent, focused and fearless, to being completely co-opted and captured."

In the May Budget, \$5.097 billion was allocated to aid for 2025–26-an increase of just \$135.8 million over the previous year. That's barely above the \$5.052 billion allocated in Julia Gillard's final budget of 2012–13. Measured as a share of gross national income (GNI)-the standard way to assess generosity over time and across nations-Australia's aid now stands at just 0.18%, the lowest since records began.

By contrast, Australia's proudest period of international generosity was during the Whitlam years, when aid reached 0.6% of GNI. With the UN's global target then at 0.7%, Australia stood among the world's leaders.

Today, as inequality deepens even within our own borders, some politicians and media voicesserving the interests of the wealthy-work to persuade ordinary Australians that we can no longer afford to help the world's poorest.

Last Sunday, I spoke about what it feels like to be an exile in one's own land. Watching these shifts unfold, I feel that sense of exile even more keenly. Yet I also see with greater clarity the truth of Jesus' good news: that it was, and remains, for the poor, the destitute, and the outcast. And so, I feel compelled all the more to speak against the manipulations of wealth and power that perpetuate suffering in our world-just as they did in his.

A New Position is being created!

Our mission here at Charlestown and Garden Suburb has always been to reach out to the community around us with God's love, inviting them to join in the activities we have provided. We shifted some of our energy a couple of years ago to the NEOS mission, becoming involved in the community organisations such as Hunter Community Alliance and the Charlestown Sustainability Group and to meet up with others over coffee in the local shopping centres.

The church council and SFED (Spiritual Formation Education and Discipleship) have now added a new string to our bow of mission. We recognise that we provide and maintain the building where many community groups meet and we can play our part in building sense of community by publicising their activities to each other and beyond. Spiritual Practice of the Week

Inner Healing Prayer: Prayer for inner healing invites those with emotional wounds to enter the safe and healing presence of Jesus. In this safe place those seeking wholeness and freedom open themselves to listen to Jesus and his word to them.

Practice: Take a "needs mending" inventory. Set aside time for several days or weeks to be in the presence of Jesus with your wounds. Gather a list of wounded places and tender relationships that need mending. Simply gather the list. Let it grow as other wounds come to mind. Leave it with God. At another time, come to God in a safe and guiet place where you can attend to the list in the presence of the great Physician. Breathe deeply. Inhale the closeness of Jesus. He is nearer than your own breath. Don't hurry. Wait in his presence. • When you are ready, set the list before the Lord and wait. What one item seems to have your attention? (Attend to one wound at a time. Don't move on to another wound until you sense that the time has come to do so.) Ask Jesus what he wants to tell you about this wound. Listen. What do you sense the Lord is saying to you? • Respond to Jesus. Trust Jesus to do what he needs to do. The fruit of healing may not be a big feeling of release at the time of prayer, but changed internal responses as time goes by. Over time you may notice that your internal responses to people and situations begin to shift. Talk to God about this.
