#### From Rev Tom

Canadian intellectual and communications theorist Marshall McLuhan, who lived from 1911 to 1980, famously coined the phrase "the medium is the message." McLuhan argued that the form a message takes shapes us more profoundly than the content it carries. I am, in a sense, pre-empting the theme of the Christmas Eve service in what I am saying here. However, there are aspects of this reflection that I would not speak in the same way in a setting where children are likely present.

We know a great deal about the content of Jesus' message. Yet when we first encounter him in the Gospel story, we do not meet a teacher or a preacher, but a newborn child - vulnerable, dependent, and largely unnoticed by the world. That child is the medium. And if the medium is the message, then we must ask: what is the message being communicated?

From the very beginning it is clear that the reception of Jesus is a matter of human choice. According to the story, he was not welcomed - and yet he came anyway. He arrived fragile and dependent, carrying nothing but love. That, after all, is what babies do. Few people remain untouched by the presence of a child. Hearts soften, attention shifts, priorities change. From the outset, Jesus is transformative. Yet this transformation does not come by force. We are not seized or compelled; rather, we are invited to embrace. The freedom of response is entirely ours.

The nearness of Christmas following the horrific attack that occurred on Sunday only sharpens the contrast. The selfishness of those responsible is beyond comprehension, and the damage inflicted is both deeply personal and profoundly national. Lives have been lost; other lives have been irrevocably altered through injury, fear, and grief.

And yet, for us, the image of the Christ child remains before us and continues to shape our response. It calls us toward connection rather than isolation, toward presence in vulnerability, and toward hearts that are open to transformation. The longer story of Jesus makes clear that this way is costly - but it is also the only path that leads to genuine peace and reconciliation.

My prayer is that we hold fast to the way revealed to us in the Christ child, especially as recriminations inevitably arise. Whether quietly in our hearts, or in practical and tangible acts, may we communicate that love to all who are impacted by this needless tragedy.

This is how, even in the midst of darkness, the light continues to shine.



The Uniting Church in Australia expresses its deep sorrow following the attack at Bondi Beach, which NSW Police have identified as a terrorist act.

The violence occurred while families and children were gathered to celebrate the start of Hanukkah, a long-held religious tradition, in peace. What should have been a time of joy, faith and community was instead marked by fear and devastation.

We grieve the lives lost and hold in prayer all who have been injured, traumatised and affected.

As the Uniting Church in Australia, we unequivocally state that any attack on families and children gathered peacefully to celebrate faith is utterly unacceptable. We name and reject

antisemitism in all its forms. Violence and hatred must never have the final word.

We stand in solidarity with the Jewish community and commit ourselves again to compassion, peace, and care for one another. We reaffirm our commitment to stand with our Jewish friends against hatred, violence, and fear. This horrifying moment reminds us as a nation that the safety and dignity of our neighbours must never be taken for granted and that protecting one another, especially children and those targeted for their faith, is a shared responsibility.

The Uniting Church affirms the dignity of every person and the right of all people to gather, worship, and celebrate their traditions without fear or violence.

At moments like this, when terror seeks to unsettle our sense of safety and unity, we reject fear, hatred, and division. As a Christian church, shaped by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, we are called to speak with moral clarity and to act with deep compassion.

We give thanks for the courage and care of first responders, health workers, and all who have supported those affected during this time.

We invite the church and the wider community to join us in prayer and quiet reflection for all who are grieving today.

The Uniting Church continues to hold in prayer the Jewish community, the families and children impacted, and the wider community as it grieves and seeks healing.
