### From Rev Tom

This has been a massive week for The Hunter Community Alliance, and of course, that means a great week for the Hunter. So, I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who attended the recent Assembly. Your active participation was instrumental in achieving some signature advancements for the Hunter region to date.

Addressing the Housing Crisis - The Hunter region has been facing a pressing housing crisis, with a significant shortage of affordable housing options. The Assembly highlighted the urgent need for action, and I am pleased to report that our advocacy has contributed to securing \$450,000 in funding to kick-start a 'tenant-led renewal' of Hamilton South housing estate. This project is part of much-needed housing support to vulnerable members of our community, marking a significant step forward in the planning process of addressing the housing challenges in our region.

Advocating for Affordable Energy Solutions - In collaboration with the Sydney Alliance, our collective efforts have led to the federal government's announcement of a 30% upfront discount on home battery systems at a cost of \$2.3 billion. This initiative, part of the Cheaper Home Batteries Program set to commence on July 1, 2025, aims to make battery storage more accessible and affordable for households. By enabling residents to store excess solar energy, this program not only reduces electricity bills but also alleviates pressure on the national energy grid during peak times. This achievement underscores the power of community-led action in influencing policy changes that benefit both individuals and the broader environment. Chris Bowen expressed his thanks to the HCA and Sydney Alliance for helping get this through.

**Empowering Our Community Through Renewable Energy -** One of our notable accomplishments is the progress toward establishing local energy hubs. These hubs are designed to serve as community centres where residents can access information and resources related to renewable energy projects. The Renewable Energy Alliance and the Community Power Agency have been advocating for federal funding to support 50 such hubs nationwide, aiming to enhance community engagement in renewable initiatives. This endeavour is crucial for ensuring that our community remains informed and involved as Australia transitions to cleaner energy sources.

**Looking Ahead -** These achievements are a testament to what we as a church accomplish when we unite with other groups for a common purpose. However, our work is far from over. We must continue to advocate for equitable access to renewable energy solutions, ensuring that renters, social housing residents, and culturally and linguistically diverse communities are not left behind. Additionally, ongoing efforts are needed to address the housing crisis comprehensively, providing secure and affordable housing for all residents of the Hunter region. What these wins prove is that we can and do make a difference. **Cont. Over.....**  So again, thank you to everyone who attended the Assembly and contributed to these monumental wins for our community. Your support and collective action are showing everyone what we can achieve working together, paving the way for a more sustainable and equitable future in the Hunter region. Well done!!
