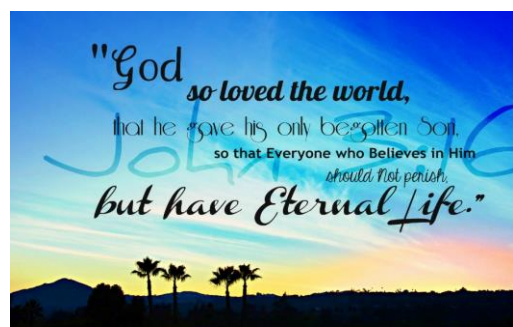

From Rev Tom

The SFED Group is still reading “The Spirituality of Age: A Seeker’s Guide to Growing Older”. Last week I experienced part of that process in reality. I received a phone call with news that Enid Hancock was in John Hunter Hospital and that she was being treated with palliative care. She hoped to speak to me. I was mowing the lawn when I got the phone call. So, after cleaning up and getting changed I headed for the Hospital. It is not always possible to grab such moments so I made short work of getting to Enid. While it was evident that Enid was weak, and did not have her usual colour, she was clear of mind. We talked about quite a few things, remembered happenings and people, and reflected on her present circumstance. As usual Enid did not avoid the reality of her circumstances, nor did she dramatize anything. Simple, and clear. I asked her if she felt ready, in this final stage of this earthly journey, preparing to step out into God’s love. It seemed like a normal conversation – as if we were having a chat over a cup of tea – even while very special, filled with love. Enid looked directly forward for a moment, and without any sense of apprehension she told me that she was ready. She described a few worries that she had for those who she would leave behind, but there seemed to be a sense of trust that all will be well. Everything about her, her demeanor, the measure of her speech, complete absence of any hint of anxiety, and a certain rarity in the atmosphere confirmed her words – “I am ready!” I have heard it said that our death is the most dramatic psychological event in our lives. That would seem a pretty obvious thing to say. But it never ceases to amaze me the times I have found the person who is dying demonstrating such profound peace. Enid described herself as having had a blessed life. Perhaps she did, but I can’t help but wonder if that will be perspective for most of us as we are nearing our final breath. We worry ourselves ragged at times as we are living our lives, but afterward we see it differently. Do we see it differently in the end because every bit of it was our life, and who we are in that moment wouldn’t be if any part of that life was missing? Is it because when we look back on our lives we see with a greater sense of the love that has sustained us on our way, good times and bad? Is it because, as we are about to let everything go we no longer have to care about security, prestige, and power? So, we are free to sense the goodness that abounds in the present moment, and every moment. We shared a prayer in the final moments of our time together. I felt the nearness of God particularly in that time – somehow radiating from Enid. Indeed, a privileged graced time. There was a very difficult moment however, that pressed on me heavily – as I walked out the door knowing for the last time. The words that came out of my mouth were just habit, and caught me out, “Bye for now!” But maybe there is something deeper in me that wanted to express this as truth. So, Enid breathed her last on Monday night. We mourn and we remember – we too remember a blessed life – and we have opportunity to gather on Wednesday 31st, 10am at the Charlestown Church, to give thanks for the life of Enid Hancock.

Notes from Church Council Chairperson

Greetings all

As always, we are the recipients of God's care and grace as we step into the path being prepared for us. Here are a few recent footsteps:

- The Church Council recently submitted an Expression of Interest to Synod for funding from the Synod Growth Fund. Unfortunately, we were not invited to proceed into the next round of applications. The application process did provide us with an opportunity to consider some of the practical aspects of moving forward with our Mission Plan, so it was a valuable experience. Synod will be providing us with some feedback, which will be useful in future applications.
- With the assistance of the Uniting Church's Synod property team, an agent has been engaged to market the Whitebridge property for leasing. We have no way of knowing how long it will take to find a suitable tenant.
- Rev Dr Cameron Eccleston from Uniting Mission and Education presented the first of four workshops on Mission at this week's Hunter Presbytery meeting. The focus was on a Presbytery strategy for the future. Our congregation was very well represented with seven members of the leadership attending to contribute to discussions.

Thank you for your continuing prayers and encouragement. The next Church Council meeting is on Tuesday afternoon, 6 September.

Progress Report - Leasing Whitebridge Church

Last Monday three people on behalf of the Church Council met with Alfred Santos of the Strategic Property & Operations group at Synod Office and two staff of the real estate company Knight Frank. We have selected Knight Frank to handle the leasing process.

They had a good look around the site and have made arrangements to come and take photos later in the week. It is planned that the marketing campaign will go live on 5th September - after which people will be shown around the site (including allowing for ongoing use of the building).

It is very uncertain how long it will be before someone expresses a commitment to leasing - it could be weeks to many months. Once that stage is reached we will have minimum 6 weeks to provide vacant occupancy (but could be longer).

Vacant occupancy is when all the contents has been removed plus any fixtures we wish to retain. Whitebridge Property and the Wellness Centre committees has already started looking at this process.

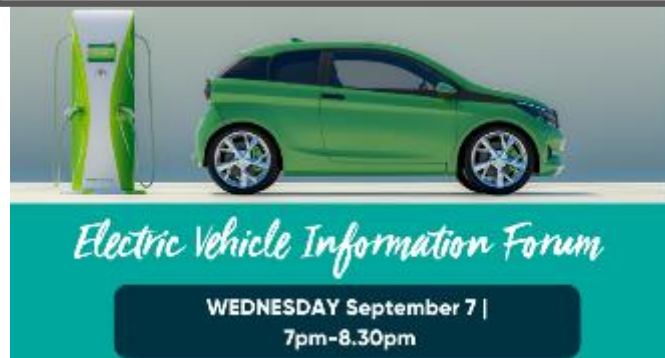
